1.0	Introduction
	The West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board
	The West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board (WBJEEB) was established in 1962 by Government of West Bengal in exercise of the powers conferred under article 162 of the Constitution of India in pursuant to No. 828-Edn(T), dated 02.03.1962.
	Subsequently in 2014, the Government of West Bengal enacted the West Bengal Act XIV of 2014 to form The West Bengal Joint Entrance Examinations Board (hereinafter called ' Board ') and empowered it to conduct Common Entrance Examinations for selection of candidates for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate Professional, Vocational and General Degree Courses in the State of West Bengal and to conduct on-line counselling process or otherwise adopting a single-window approach.
	WBJEEB has been instrumental in the admission process based on online application and allotment through e-Counselling since 2012. It advocates fairness and transparency, ensures no-error, and adopts state-of-the-art technology.
2.0	The Examination (JELET-2024)
	WBJEEB will conduct OMR based Common Entrance Test (JELET-2024) for admission in the academic session 2024-25 into 2 nd year (3 rd semester) of 4-year Undergraduate Courses in Engineering/ Technology and Pharmacy of different Universities, Government Colleges as well as Self Financing Engineering & Technological Institutes in the State of West Bengal.
2.1	Schedule of JELET-2024
	29 th June 2024 (Saturday), 11 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
	JELET-2024 will be held once only and there shall be no further examination under any circumstances for those who are unable to appear on the date and time of JELET-2024 examination mentioned above.
2.2	Pattern of question papers
	A. At the time of online application, candidates will select his/her qualifying examination among:
	i. Diploma in Engineering/Technology
	ii. Diploma in Pharmacy
	iii. B.Sc.
	B. There will be two separate papers namely,
	i. Paper-I for Diploma in Engineering/Technology OR B.Sc. candidates.
	ii. Paper-II for Diploma in Pharmacy candidates.

- options. Time for the paper is 2 hours. The questions will be in **English language** only.

2.4 Scoring Methodology

	b) Correct response will yield 1 (one) mark for each question.
	c) Incorrect response will yield -1/4 (25% negative) marks for each question.
	d) For any combination of more than one option, even if it contains the correct option, the said answer will be treated as incorrect and will yield -¼ (negative ¼) marks.
	e) Not attempting the question will fetch zero mark.
2	a) One or more options is/are correct.
	b) Marking all correct options only will yield 2 (two) marks.
	c) For any combination of answers containing one or more incorrect options, the said answer will be treated as incorrect, and it will yield zero (0) mark even if one or more of the chosen options is/are correct
	 d) For partially correct answers, i.e., when all correct options are no marked and also no incorrect options are marked, marks awarded = x (no of correct options marked) / (total no of actually correct options)
	e) Not attempting the question will fetch 0 marks

2.5	Mode of answering in the examination
	• Questions are to be answered on specially designed optical machine-readable response (OMR) sheet, which will be evaluated by Optical Mark Recognition method. Thus, it is very important to follow the correct method of marking.
	• Candidates will indicate response to the questions by darkening the appropriate circle/bubble completely with blue/black ink ball point pen .
	• Any other kind of marking e.g., filling the circle/bubble incompletely, filling with pencil, cross mark, tick mark, dot mark, circular mark, over writing, scratching, erasing, white ink, marking outside the circle/bubble etc. may lead to wrong/partial/ambiguous reading of the response. WBJEEB will be, in no way, responsible for such eventuality and this may lead to cancellation of OMR sheet.
	 Response marking cannot be edited/changed/erased/modified.
2.6	Ranking Methodology and publication of Merit Lists
	 a) WBJEEB will prepare merit ranks based on the candidates' score in the Common Entrance Test. Individual candidates will be able to view and download his/her Rank Card, which will contain score and rank. WBJEEB does not publish any rank/score list for public to ensure confidentiality to each individual candidate.
	b) The rank shall be in the name and style of 'GMR' (General Merit Rank)/ 'PMR' (Pharmacy Merit Rank).
	c) Two (2) separate rank lists will be prepared based on the candidates' qualifying examination, e.g.
	i. Diploma in Engineering/ Technology OR B.Sc. (GMR).
	ii. Diploma in Pharmacy. (PMR).
	d) The sequence of GMR/PMR will be prepared based on the marks scored.
	e) Ranking shall be done in the descending order of marks scored. In case of ties, tie- breaking rules as given in 2.7 shall be applicable.
	f) Separate reserved category merit position will also be indicated for respective category of students e.g., SC Rank, ST Rank, OBC-A Rank, OBC-B Rank, PWD Rank, EWS Rank etc., as applicable.
	g) Sequencing order for counselling/allotment of seat/admission will be based on GMR only (not on category ranks). Category ranks are for information only to candidates of respective category.
	h) Category ranks are generated based on the category information given by the candidates during online application, but documents are verified by the allotted Institutes during counselling and admission. Hence candidate's certificates/ documents/ proofs must be valid as on the date of verification. If during verification, any candidate's claim is found invalid at that time, his/her category rank will be cancelled, and the candidate will be considered thereafter in general category. Category ranks of other candidates will not be revised.

3.0	Eligibility and academic qualification criteria
3.1	Eligibility criteria for application
	a) Citizenship: Applicant must be a citizen of India.
	 b) Age Restriction: I. There is no upper age limit for Diploma holders in Engineering/ Technology/ Pharmacy.
	II. For B. Sc. Candidates, the upper age limit is 27 (twenty-seven) years as on
	31.12.2024. III. For Diploma holders in marine Engineering, the upper age limit is 25 (twenty-five) years as on 31.12.2024.
3.2	Eligibility criteria for admission
5.2	(A) Diploma holders seeking admission in Engineering & Technology Degree
	 Courses: i) Passed Minimum Three years / Two years (Lateral Entry) Diploma examination with at least 45% marks (40% marks in case of candidates belonging to reserved category) in ANY branch of Engineering and Technology [as given in the table 8.2(viii) in AICTE Approval Process Handbook-2024-2027].
	OR Passed B.Sc. Degree from a recognized University as defined by UGC, with at least 45% marks (40% marks in case of candidates belonging to reserved category) and passed 10+2 examination with Mathematics as a subject [as given in the table 8.2(viii) in AICTE Approval Process Handbook-2024-2027]. OR
	Passed B.Voc/3-year D.Voc. Stream in the same or allied sector [as given in the table 8.2 (viii) in AICTE Approval Process Handbook-2024-2027].
	(The Universities will offer suitable bridge courses such as Mathematics, Physics, Engineering drawing, etc., for the students coming from diverse backgrounds to achieve desired learning outcomes of the programme)
	N.B.: Reserved Category belongs to SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PwD
	 But for admission in Jadavpur University, the candidate must secure at least 60% (45% for SC/ ST/ OBC-A/ OBC-B/ PwD) marks or equivalent CGPA in diploma examination. D.Voc. Candidates are not eligible for admission in Jadavpur University through lateral entry.

- **iii)** All relevant norms of **D. G. Shipping** will be applicable for admission into Degree Course in Marine Engineering.
- (B) B. Sc./B.Voc. candidates seeking admission into Engineering & Technology Degree Course:
 - i) The candidate must pass B. Sc. /B.Voc. Degree from any University recognized by UGC with at least 45% (40% for SC/ ST/ OBC-A/ OBC-B/ PwD) marks.
 - ii) Also, the B.Sc. candidate must have passed 12th standard school examination with Mathematics as a subject.
 - **iii)** The candidate, if admitted, will have to clear the subjects of Engineering Mechanics and Engineering Graphics / Engineering Drawing of the 1st year Degree Course in Engineering/Technology along with their second-year subjects.
 - iv) B.Sc./B.Voc. candidates will be considered for admission only if vacancies remain even after filling the seats with available Diploma holder candidates.
 - v) B. Sc. /B.Voc. Candidates are not eligible for admission into Degree Course in Pharmacy.
 - vi) B. Sc./B.Voc. Candidates are not eligible for admission in Jadavpur University through lateral entry.
- (C) Both B. Sc. Candidates and Diploma holders in Engineering & Technology will also be eligible for admission to the 1st year Engineering Degree Courses, subject to vacancies in the 1st year classes in case the vacancies as lateral entry at second year are exhausted. However, the admission shall be based strictly on the eligibility criteria as mentioned above.
- (D) Diploma holders in Pharmacy seeking admission into Degree Course in Pharmacy
 - i) The candidate must pass Diploma in Pharmacy from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.
 - ii) The candidate must secure at least 45% (40% for SC/ ST/ OBC-A/ OBC-B/ PwD) marks or equivalent CGPA.
 - iii) Such candidates will also be eligible for admission to the 1st year Degree Course subject to vacancies in the 1st year classes in case the vacancies as lateral entry at second year are exhausted. However, the admission shall be based strictly on the eligibility criteria as is mentioned above or any notification is issued by the Pharmacy Council of India on this issue.

N.B.: However, if any notification/circular is issued by the Pharmacy Council of India on the above matter, will be published in due course for taking necessary action accordingly.

3.3 Document verification

- a) Admit cards, Rank cards are issued based on the information provided by the candidate. All verifications are done during and after counselling **by the allotted Institute**. Hence candidates cannot assume that the personal information shown in the admit card, rank card are approved by the Board.
- b) If during document verification by the allotted Institute, it is found that any information given by the candidate is/are incorrect or if the candidate is unable to produce certificate/ document/ proof valid as per the then applicable rules and as on the date of its verification, his/her information will be corrected/modified accordingly which may even make him/her ineligible for some/all seats/course(s).
- c) Similarly, if at any stage during or after counselling it is found on scrutiny that the information/document(s) provided by the candidate is false/incorrect, his/her

	candidature is liable to be treated as cancelled even if he/she secured a Merit Rank and/or a seat has been allotted to the candidate. Hence, securing a Rank does not constitute a right/guarantee in favour of a candidate for his/her claim for admission if he/she fails to comply with the required criteria.			
4.0	Seat matrix			
	The seat matrix for last year i.e., for the academic session 2023-24 is given in the Board's website.			
	Seat matrix for the academic session 2024-25 will be declared by the office of The Director of Technical Education, Govt. of W.B. in due course of time and will be published at Board's web site before counselling.			
	Note that there may be other seats available in some institute/course which are not offered by them through e-counselling and hence will not appear in the seat matrix.			
5.0	Reservation of seats for students under reserved category			
	a) Reservation of Seats will be available for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PwD/EWS category of candidates as per applicable rule depending upon the type of institute. The OBC-A/OBC-B candidates belonging to Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) only are eligible for consideration as reserved candidates. OBC-A/OBC-B candidates must produce updated NCL certificate during Counselling/ Admission .			
	b) Such reservation shall be restricted to candidates who are Indian citizen and domiciled in West Bengal.			
	c) Candidates claiming reservation must submit relevant Certificate issued by the competent Authorities as given below.			
	d) Certificates are to be produced for verification by the allotted Institute during counselling, admission etc. If at that time, it is found that any information given by the candidate is/are incorrect or if the candidate is unable to produce certificate/ document/ proof valid as per the then applicable rules as on the date of its verification, his/her information will be corrected/modified accordingly which may even make him/her ineligible for some/all seats/course(s) and the candidate may be reconsidered in next round of counselling (if any).

0.0	a) The candidate must be a domicile of Home State i.e., West Bengal for admission in,			
	i. Any seat including general category seats in any Government aided Engineering / Technology / Pharmacy Colleges.			
	ii. Any seat including general category seats in Aliah University.			
	iii. Any seat including general category seats in Jadavpur University.			
	iv. Any reserved category seat (SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B, PWD and EWS) in any institute.			
	b) The candidate needs to download the required proforma as per the detail given in section 6.1 and keep the certificate ready to be produced during counseling, admission etc.			
	c) If any of the certificates is then found to be invalid, the candidate will lose the opportunity of admission in seats reserved for WB domiciled candidates.			
	d) However, Diploma holders in Fashion Technology from Govt. Polytechnic Institutions from Tripura are eligible for admission to Degree level Apparel			

	Production & Management Course and Textile Technology Course in Govt. College of Engineering and Textile Technology, Serampore and Berhampore under Lateral Entry Scheme with relaxation of (West Bengal) domicile criteria.
6.1	Criteria to be treated as domicile of West Bengal and applicable proforma of certificate
	Only those candidates will be treated as domicile of West Bengal who are either,
	a) residing in West Bengal continuously at least for last 10 (ten) years as on 31.12.2023.
	OR b) whose parent(s) is/are permanent resident(s) of West Bengal having permanent address within the State of West Bengal.
	In case of a) above, a certificate is to be obtained as per proforma 'a1' (Appendix-1).
	In case of b) above, a certificate is to be obtained in proforma 'b' (Appendix-2) or
	The candidate must produce in original any two of Voter ID card/ Aadhaar card/ Passport/ Ration card belonging to his/her parents. The said documents must justify that the residential address of parent(s) is in West Bengal.
	During counselling etc. if SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates who cannot produce required domicile certificate, they can produce/upload their category certificates (issued by the Govt. of WB) in lieu of domicile certificate. But in that case if the category certificate is found invalid at the time of verification, their domicile status is also considered to be NON-West Bengal.

	v. Corporation Area - Commissioner, Additional Commissioner, Joint Commissioner, Assistant Commissioner.
	vi. Assistant Secretary or above in the Secretariat to the Government of West Bengal (including GTA) or Central Government.
	vii. Deputy Director or above in the Directorate to the Government of West Bengal or Central Government.
	viii. Officials issuing domicile certificates MUST provide his/her full name, designation, place of posting with address, land line/mobile number. He/she should also provide his/her identity card number if available.
	ix. Collector of Kolkata (Stamp and Revenue) located at 11, N.S. Road, Kolkata-700001 for the inhabitants under the jurisdiction of Kolkata Police Area.

	b) Note: Domicile certificates issued by any elected people's representative such as municipal commissioner, Councillor of Municipal Corporation/ Municipality, Member of three-tier Panchayat system or GTA, MLA or MP are not acceptable.

8.0	Competent Authorities for the issuance of OBC-A (NCL*) / OBC-B (NCL*) Certificate for WB domicile candidates claiming under such reserve category of seats
	As per Notification vide No. 374(71)-TW/EC/MR-103/94 dated 27/7/1994, read with Memorandum No. 1204-SBCW/MR-67/10 dated 27/7/2015 issued by Backward Classes Welfare Department. Govt. of W.B., the Sub Divisional Officer of a Sub- Division in a District is the certificate issuing authority. In Kolkata such certificate is issued by such an officer as the State Government by modification authorizes. Accordingly, the District Welfare Officer, Kolkata, and Ex-officio Joint Director, BCW Dept. has been notified to act as the certificate issuing authority in respect of Kolkata covering the jurisdiction of the Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

JELET SYLLABUS

Mathematics (JELET)

A. Matrices up to order 3:

Definition of Matrix and its order. Different types of Matrices. (Rectangular, square, row, column, upper triangular, lower triangular, diagonal, scalar, identity, null). Equality of two matrices. Addition, subtraction, multiplication of a matrix by a scalar and multiplication of two matrices. Transpose of a matrix, symmetric and skew symmetric matrices, simple problems. Singular and non-singular matrices, adjoint and inverse of a matrix of order 3.

Eigen Values of matrix up to order 3. Statement of Cauchy Hamilton Theorem and application for determining inverse of matrix. Diagonalization of matrices.

B. Determinant up to order 3:

Definition and expansion of determinants of order 2 and 3. Minor and cofactors. Elementary properties of Determinants (statements only) and simple problems. Solutions of linear simultaneous equations (up to 3 unknowns) by Cramer's Rule.

Rank of a matrix up to order 3. Linear homogeneous and non-homogeneous system of equations – statements of the relevant results and its applications.

C. Complex Number:

Definition of complex numbers, Cartesian and polar. Exponential form of complex numbers. Modulus, amplitude and conjugate of a complex number. Algebra of complex numbers (Equality, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication). Cube roots of unity and its properties. De Moivre's theorem (statements only) and simple problems.

D. Co-ordinate Geometry(2D):

Concept of polar co-ordinates and its relation to Cartesian co-ordinates. Conic section in 2D – Definition, simple properties, Tangents and Normal.

E. Vector Algebra:

Definition of a vector quantity. Concept of Position vector and Ratio formula. Rectangular resolution of a vector. Algebra of vectors – equality, addition, subtraction, and scalar multiplication. Scalar (Dot) product of two vectors of with properties. Vector (cross) product of two vectors with properties. Applications: Application of dot product in work done by a force and projection of one vector upon another, application of cross product in finding vector area and moment of a force. Scalar and vector triple product and their geometrical interpretations. Linear combination of 3 vectors. Linear dependence and independence of vectors.

F. Differential Calculus:

Concept of function of one variable – Domain and range. Type of different functions including periodic functions. Limit and continuity. Standard limits. Types of discontinuity. Derivative of a functions (1st order and 2nd order). Statements and Applications of Roll's Theorem, Mean Value Theorem. Indeterminant Form. L'Hospital's rule.

G. Application of Derivative:

Geometric meaning of derivative. Rate measurement. Maxima and Minima (one variable)

H. Partial Differentiation:

Definition and meaning of partial derivative. Evaluation of partial derivatives. Definition and examples of homogeneous functions. Euler's theorem (1st order) on homogeneous functions for 2 variables (without proof). Problems.

I. Integral Calculus:

Definition of Integration as inverse process of differentiation. Rules for integration (sum, difference, scalar multiple). Integration of standard functions. Integration by substitution. Integration by parts. Integration by partial fraction.

Definition of definite integral and simple problems. Properties of definite integral with simple problems. Application of definite integral – area of bounded region.

J. Ordinary Differential Equation:

Definition of ordinary differential equation, order and degree. Solution of differential equation of first order and first degree. Separation of variables. Homogeneous type. Exact type. Linear type. Solution of differential equation of first order but not of the first degree. Solution of linear second order differential equation with constant coefficients. Complementary Functions (C.F). Particular integral for polynomial function e^{ax} , sinax and cosax, $[F(-a^2) \neq 0] e^{ax}V$ where V is a function. Simple problem.

K. Probability:

Definition of random experiment, sample space, event, occurrence of events and types of events (e.g., Impossible, mutually exclusive, Exhaustive, Equally likely). Classical definition of probability, simple problems. Statements of total probability, compound probability and Base's Theorem and simple problems.

Physics (JELET)

- A. **Units, dimension, and measurement**: CGS, MKS, SI units. Dimensions of common physical quantities, dimensional analysis. Common errors in measurement. Error, accuracy, precision, resolution, significant figure.
- B. **Kinematics**: Speed, velocity, acceleration, uniform/non-uniform, rectilinear/ circular motion. Position/ velocity-time graph. Resolution and composition of vectors, scalar multiplication of vectors.
- C. Laws of motion: Newton's laws of motion. Force, momentum, inertia, moment of inertia, impulse, couples, moment. Conditions of equilibrium. Conservation of momentum. Centripetal and centrifugal forces. Angular displacement/ velocity/ acceleration/ momentum, torque. Static and dynamic friction, angle of repose, banking of roads.
- D. **Work, power, energy**: Definition, measures, and units. Law of conservation of energy. Kinetic and potential energy.
- E. **Gravitation**: The universal law of gravitation. Acceleration due to gravity and its variation on/ above/ below Earth's surface. Gravitational potential energy. Vertical linear/ vertical circular/ projectile motion.
- F. **Elasticity**: Deforming force and restoring force, elastic, and plastic body. Stress-strain relationship, Hook's law, Young's modulus, Bulk modulus, Rigidity modulus, Poisson's ratio and relation between them. Elastic energy.

- G. **Surface tension**: Cohesive and adhesive forces. Definition, dimension and SI unit of surface tension. Surface energy. Angle of contact. Formation of droplets, bubble; their adhesion. - D. **DC sources and circuits**: Voltage and current sources, their transformation, Thevenin's, Norton's theorems. Kirchhoff current and voltage laws. Superposition, equivalence. Determination of branch current/ voltage in passive circuits. Time domain characteristics of reactive components.
- E. **AC sources and circuits**: Amplitude, frequency, time-period, phase, peak/average/ RMS values. Exponential, complex and phasor form of representation of sinusoidal voltage and current. Impedance, power factor, active/reactive power. Voltage and current relationship in star-delta connections. Behaviour of simple RLC circuits with AC excitation.
- F. Basic semiconductor devices: Energy level diagrams of insulator, conductor & semiconductor. Intrinsic & extrinsic, P-type, N-type semiconductors. P-N junction diode. PNP and NPN transistors, MOSFET, CMOS.

- G. Analog Circuits: OPAMP, virtual ground, inverting and non-inverting amplifiers, adder, subtractor, integrator, differentiator.
- H. Digital Electronics: Boolean Algebra, basic gates (AND, OR, NOT, NAND, NOR, Ex-OR, Ex-NOR) truth tables, symbols, and combination of gates.

APPENDIX - 6

Rules of the Examination

- 1. Candidates are advised to reach the examination centers at least 30 minutes before commencement of the test.
- 2. Be sure about the exact location of your examination center and means of commuting to avoid any inconvenience, if any, on the day of examination.
- 3. No candidate will be allowed to seat for the test in any center other than the one allotted to him/her and as is mentioned in the admit card.
- 4. Any candidate found to occupy a seat other than the one allotted to him/her will be **reported against** and his/her paper will be cancelled.
- 5. Carry the following documents to enter the examination center:
 - a. A printed copy of admit card.
 - b. A copy of color photograph as was uploaded during online application.
 - c. Any photo identity card in original such as Aadhaar card/ Pan card / Passport/voter card/ 10th standard admit card/ School ID card.
- 6. Candidates are not allowed to carry any written or printed material, calculator, pen, log table, wristwatch, any communication device like mobile phones, any blue tooth device, any electronic gadgets etc. inside the examination hall. Any candidate found with such items will be reported against and his/her candidature will be summarily cancelled.
- 7. Frisking may be carried out while entering the center for checking prohibited objects/articles.
- 8. Candidates are advised to take their seats at least 15 minutes before commencement of the test.
- 9. No candidate will be allowed to enter the examination center **beyond the scheduled time of commencement of the test for each half under any circumstances**.
- 10. Question booklets will be distributed well before commencement of the test. Take out the OMR sheet and check that your OMR number and question booklet number are same. If not, ask the invigilator to replace the whole set from same series (e.g., A/B/C/D).
- 11. Put your signature on the top of question booklet.
- 12. Read the instructions given on OMR and on the cover page of question booklet very carefully.

- 13. Write question booklet number and roll number at the appropriate places on the OMR. Wrong entry of question booklet number and roll number may lead to rejection of the OMR or wrong scoring, for which the Board will not be held responsible. If any candidate makes any mistake, he/she must **not** overwrite. Request the invigilator to strike it out and rewrite the correct numbers and put his/her (Invigilator) signature.
- 14. Darken the appropriate circle/bubbles of question booklet number, roll number and question booklet series (e.g., A/B/C/D).
- 15. Write your name in BLOCK LETTERS, name of the center and put your signature in appropriate places on the OMR. Do not put any stray mark anywhere else; it may lead to rejection of OMR.
- 16. Check that your roll number, photograph, spelling of your name in the attendance sheet matches with those given in your admit card. If any correction is needed, bring it to the notice of the invigilator.
- 17. Question booklets can be opened only at the time of commencement of test and as will be announced by the invigilator. Check all the pages of question booklet. If there is any damage or missing page or any difficulties to read the question booklet, ask your invigilator to replace the whole set from the same series (e.g., A/B/C/D).
- 18. Maintain silence during the test. Any conversation/gesticulation or creation of disturbances will be deemed as misdemeanor. If any candidate is found adopting any unfair means, his/her candidature will be cancelled, and / or he/she will be debarred either permanently or for a period as is deemed fit by the Centre- in- Charge.
- 19. No discussion will be allowed with the invigilator regarding any question.
- 20. Candidates may do rough work in the space provided in the question booklet.
- 21. No candidate will leave his/her seat without permission of the invigilator until the test is over.
- 22. No candidate will leave the hall till the end of the test and all OMRs are collected and tallied by the invigilator.
- 23. Candidates are allowed to take his/her question booklet after the test.
- 24. If any examinee is found impersonating, he/she will be **handed over to the police** and candidature of the original candidate will be cancelled outright.

Appendix-8

THE SCHEDULE [See clause (zc) of section 2] SPECIFIED DISABILITY

1. Physical disability

A. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

(a) "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

(i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eyelid but with no manifest deformity;

(ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;

(iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;

(b) "**cerebral palsy**" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

(c) "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimetres) or less;

(d) "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;

(e) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment—

(a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—

- (i) total absence of sight; or
- (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
- (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

(b) "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:

(i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or

(ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

C. Hearing impairment—

(a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

(b) "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

D. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

(a) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;

(b) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour

"**Mental illness**" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by sub-normality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to—

(a) chronic neurological conditions, such as—

(i) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;

(ii) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

(b) Blood disorder

(i) "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor would may result in fatal bleeding;

(ii) "thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

6. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government
